

Project's updates

The Traceus project has entered its final month! All our objectives have been achieved, or are in the process of being achieved.

The online platform has been modified by CARDET, our Cypriot partner, with feedback from our participants, in order to constantly improve our content and training and to make the platform as more user-friendly as possible.

The videos made by the participants with the help of the project partners are also uploaded to our Youtube account (TRACEUS eLearning), so that anyone interested can find the Traceus project recipes and make them easily at home.

Some of these videos are currently being translated by the partners so that they can be subtitled in English to ensure their accessibility to as many people as possible.

And now that the tests with the seniors have been completed, and their feedback has been taken into account and implemented in the platform and the training courses, the Traceus partners can move on to the last stage of testing: testing and validation with young people.

Two young people from each country, for a total of twelve young people, and from about 15 to 25 years old, have now started to review the platform. As for the seniors, they will follow the training proposed in the 5 modules accessible on the platform.

They will also cook, film and edit their videos which will then be published on the project's Youtube account, to ensure that they can reuse what they have learned.

This will allow us to find out if our platform is actually usable and interesting for young people as well as for old people, and if our solution is interoperable.

Cyprus Omelette

It is a simple, quick and hearty dish, consisting of an assorted potato, sausage and halloumi omelette.

Potato Casserole and Hâ

This recipe comes from Normandy, and consists of potatoes cooked in a casserole with wine and herbs, and is accompanied here by hâ, a small coastal shark frequently caught in the Atlantic.

Gemista & Koupepia

Both dishes are classics of Eastern Mediterranean cuisine. Koupepia are vine leaves stuffed with minced meat and covered with peeled tomatoes, and gemista is a dish of summer vegetables stuffed with rice, all of which create a rainbow of colour on the plate! This typical cake from eastern France and Germany, meaning "Christmas roll", is a dry marzipan cake with spices and candied fruit.
